






















This worksheet gives your child the chance to practice reading the 'ch' sound.

• Read each of the words. With practice, they should be able to recognise and correctly read the 'ch' sound.











• Read each of the words. Over time, they should become aware of words that contain 'ck' and be able to spell these words correctly.


