Long 'o' sound

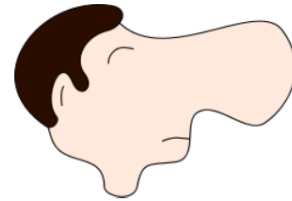
Note the difference the 'e' makes in these word pairs: hop & hope and not & note. The addition of the 'e' causes the 'o' to have a long vowel sound.

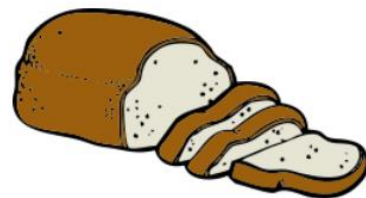
